Since its inception, NiCo has served as a caring refuge for first, second, and third graders in Laz Paz, Honduras. From tutoring to Bible classes, group and individual therapy, play time and nutritional meals, the staff at NiCo takes every opportunity to demonstrate their unconditional love to children who need a helping hand with their education.

In 2018, NiCo opened its doors to fourth, fifth, and sixth graders. Austin South, Orphan Outreach Regional Director for Latin America, says, "Being able to serve a child for six years means we have more time to instill the tools that they'll need as they walk through life. Our goal is not to get kids to have perfect grades; our goal is to teach kids critical thinking skills, self-regulation of emotion, the values of telling the truth, of taking care of themselves and their home, and respecting others. We can impact this community by helping children to become better equipped to face life."

All life needs water to survive. In Kenya, now water is bringing hope as well.

"There's never been enough water for the students" and the community surrounding ACK Madeleine School. During rainy season, things are a little better. But often, mothers have had to walk three miles to a creek to collect jugs of water that isn't safe for drinking. What God has done this year at both Madeleine School and Patmos Junior School is a miracle. He has made a way," says Amy Norton, Vice President of Strategic Partnerships for Orphan Outreach.

God's way included donors, rotary groups, and grants. And His response was two deep-water wells. Both wells were dug near the schools, and both are providing students and their families with safe, clean drinking water. Health and sanitation have improved. *Hope is springing to life.*

2018 Mission Trip Highlights

Orphan Outreach mission teams are trained and equipped to work alongside our national ministry partners, providing meaningful support and encouragement while reinforcing dignity in the lives of all we serve. Teams gain a deeper understanding of God's heart for the fatherless as they learn best practices in sustainable care for orphaned and vulnerable children. And short-term mission trips become the catalyst for long-term impact through sponsorship, church partnership, advocacy, and prayer.

57 mission teams served in a variety of meaningful ways, including:

- Sharing the Gospel and offering discipleship training • Providing training and mentorship to caregivers,

- Teaching independent living skills to young adults • Ministering to children with special needs
- Hosting medical clinics

- aid to people who work and live in impoverished communities

745 people traveled to Africa, Asia, Central America, and Eastern Europe to serve orphaned and vulnerable children at Orphan Outreach ministry partnership locations.

2018 Sponsorship Highlights

Child sponsorship through Orphan Outreach provides supporters with the unique opportunity to have a lasting impact on an individual child in our ministry programs around the world. Sponsorship is one of the most important ways an individual can make a sustainable difference in the life of a child.

890 children are currently sponsored in Guatemala, Honduras, India, Kenya, Latvia, Russia, Nepal and Ukraine. These sponsorships meet critical needs throughout the year.

Joseph's DreamCoat

Children are born to belong, and Joseph's DreamCoat is a ministry making forever families possible. Joseph's DreamCoat provides adoption grants to families who are committed and faithful Christ-followers.

In 2018, Joseph's DreamCoat awarded adoption grants to 25 families.





2019 Children's Hope Dinner

The sixth annual Children's Hope Dinner benefiting Orphan Outreach was an evening of inspiration for the 600 guests in attendance. The sold-out event raised more than \$400,000 to make ministry efforts in Central America, Asia, Africa, Eastern Europe, and the U.S. possible.

Allie Beth and Pierce Allman, 2019 Children's Hope Award recipients, have been giving back to the Dallas community for decades. Their motivation for giving is based on the biblical precept found in Matthew 7:12—the Golden Rule.

Special guest Jason Witten, Dallas Cowboys tight end, joined master of ceremonies Scott Hanson of the NFL RedZone to share his personal testimony of rescue and redemption from abuse. Jason encouraged the audience to consider the impact of giving their time, talent, and treasure.



Women for Orphans Worldwide (WOW) is the auxiliary of Orphan Outreach. WOW supports the Orphan Outreach programs in Guatemala by providing educational assistance, outreach and other critical needs of children and families.

In December 2018, the founding Dallas chapter of WOW celebrated the 10th annual WOW Dallas Luncheon and Guatemalan market raising \$180,000 for the needs of orphaned and vulnerable children in Guatemala WOW Houston launched their first annual Circle of Joy Guatemalan Market raising nearly \$40,000 for children in Guatemala. WOW completed seven Orphan Outreach mission trips, and collected humanitarian aid and raised awareness for supporting orphans in need.
